Baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God which continues for the rest of our lives and is the first step in response to God's love. It is a joyful moment when we rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring our faith.



This service paints vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian journey. There is the sign of the cross, reminding us of Christ's death for us. Our 'drowning' in the water of baptism is where we believe we die to sin and are raised to new life, uniting us to Christ's dying and rising. And water is also a sign of new life, as we are born again by water and the Spirit.

Gospel reading – Mark 6:30-34, 53-end read by Pat French

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark **Glory to you, O Lord.**

The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest."

So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

When they had crossed over, they landed at Gennesaret and anchored there. As soon as they got out of the boat, people recognized Jesus. They ran throughout that whole region and carried the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. And wherever he went—into villages, towns or countryside—they placed the sick in the marketplaces. They begged him to let them touch even the edge of his cloak, and all who touched it were healed.

Therefore, parents and godparents I ask,

Will you take steps to empty out of your life attitudes and actions that are wrong?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you turn to Jesus to cleanse, heal and rescue you from all that destroys life?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you follow Jesus' teaching and example, fighting against evil and standing up for good?

With the help of God, I will.

Sign of the cross

Athena, Jesus claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of our crucified Saviour.

Fight bravely as a follower of Jesus against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Jesus to the end of your life.

May God, who receives you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace that as you travel with all God's family you may daily be renewed by his Spirit, and come to inherit heavenly glory. **Amen.**
