²⁶ People will faint from terror, apprehensive of what is coming on the world, for the heavenly bodies will be shaken.
²⁷ At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.
²⁸ When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.' ²⁹ He told them this parable: 'Look at the fig-tree and all the trees. ³⁰ When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near.
